Preschool Screening

Friday, February 28, 2020

The Randolph School District will be conducting a screening for preschool children living in the Randolph School District. The Staff will be screening Randolph children who will be three and four years old on or before September 1, 2020. The screening will be at the Randolph Elementary School, located at 110 Meadowood Drive on Friday, February 28, 2020. Please enter through the Elementary entrance doors (Door #11) near the playground. Please park on the south end of the building, near the basketball courts/baseball diamond.

Parents of all three-year-old and four-year-old children were sent a letter with a scheduled screening appointment. If you are a parent of a child who will be three or four years old on or before September 1, 2020, and have not received information, please contact the Randolph Elementary School office at (920) 326-2431, ext. 2120. Nonresident families planning to open enroll their 4-year-old in Randolph Elementary School for 2020-2021 school year should contact their "resident" district to schedule preschool screening.

The purpose of the screening is to identify visual, hearing, or health-related problems that could interfere with success in school. The screening can also identify developmental delays that could impact adjustment to the school setting. Studies have found that helping children at an early age produces the best outcomes for children and their families versus waiting until the child enters school. Recommendations and referrals will be provided to parents as needed.

Parents, please bring your child's birth certificate (required for identification), baby book, and completed immunization record (or immunization record printed from the Wisconsin Immunization Registry website). Parents should return the Ages & Stages Questionnaire and Child Development Review sheet prior to the screening in the envelope provided.

After completion of the screening procedures, you will receive the results. Should you have a conflict with the schedule or have any questions, please contact the Elementary School Office at (920) 326-2431, ext. 2120. If there is a delayed start or a snow day, the district will contact you to reschedule the screening.

Winter Weather Conditions - Closings and Delays

During times of inclement weather conditions, the Randolph School District follows guidelines for deciding if schools will be open or closed; always based on student safety, we try to make the best decision for all students.

Randolph School District personnel continuously reviews weather conditions to make the best decision based on numerous factors. After consulting the weather stations, the Village of Randolph, Dodge and Columbia Highway departments, and local law enforcement, calls are made to the area school districts and a decision to hold, delay or close school is made.

If a school delay is warranted, the school will begin two hours later than normal time and morning Pre-Kindergarten and Early Childhood classes will be canceled. If school has begun and an early school closing is warranted, there will be no afternoon Pre-Kindergarten, which will be communicated with families on a district-wide level at the time of the event.

Parents/guardians will receive an email, call or text through our Skylert automated messenger system notifying them of a school delay or cancellation. Then, this decision is communicated to local radio stations, TV stations (WISC 3, WMTV 15 and WKOW 27), and our Randolph School District Facebook page for information regarding school closings or delays.

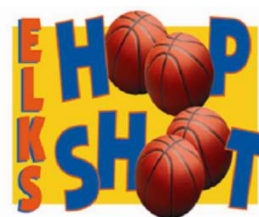

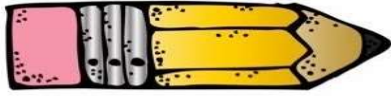

DANGEROUS MISPERCEPTIONS TEENS HAVE ABOUT VAPING ALONG WITH THE FACTS

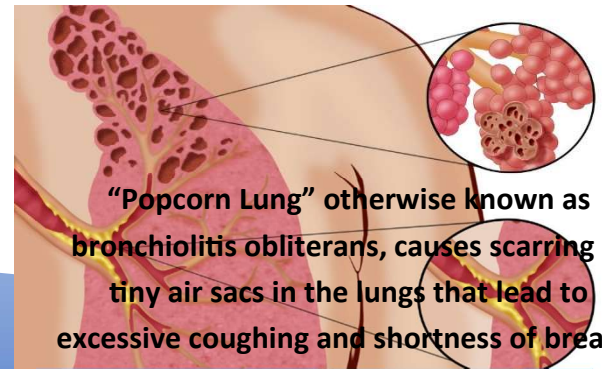
The aerosol produced from vapes is **NOT** just water vapor!
