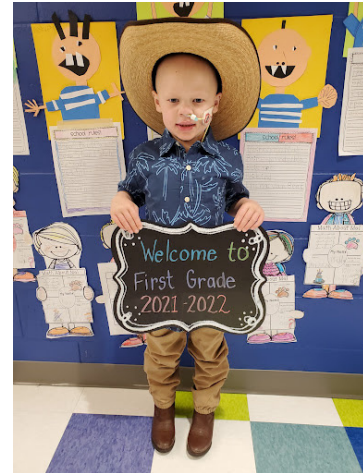


# R-E-S-O-L-V-E

This year in the month of November, students volunteered to “RESOLVE” to fight leukemia and lymphoma in support of fellow student, Liam Sanborn. Our students focused on “giving & gratitude” in the month of November, and RESOLVE participation was an opportunity to practice those attributes.

Do you know Liam Sanborn? He is a 1st grade student in our district. He is an outgoing, smiley, fun-loving 6-year-old that has been in the hospital almost this whole past summer and now into the Fall. He was diagnosed with his 1st type of leukemia at 11 months old and has been diagnosed with 3 more types since. Liam is a fighter and we want him to know that we are here to help him fight! Please help us dedicate our 2021 R.E.S.O.L.V.E. to fight leukemia and lymphoma in honor of Liam!



After funding all event expenses, funds are disbursed as follows:

- 25% = global gift to a nonprofit organization
- 50% = local gift to a nonprofit organization
- 25% = PTO to continue supporting education at RSD

Started in the 2018-19 school year, RESOLVE continues a great tradition of giving. On November 8th, our students, staff, and special guests were finally able to gather and celebrate their RESOLVE efforts for the 2019-20 & 2020-21 events at a dedication assembly. We accomplished so much!

### **2019-20 = "RESOLVE for the Armed Forces"**

In the 2019-20 event, our global & local RESOLVE gifts were combined and presented to the Patriot K9s of Wisconsin. The gifted funds have been earmarked for the purchase of puppies that will enter the service dog program for veterans. To help us celebrate, Mr. Rethaber (Executive Director) attended the assembly with a trainer, a veteran (who received one of the puppies purchased with RESOLVE funds), and another service dog. It was so moving to hear about this program first hand. There were tears and laughter as Mr. Rethaber and the guest Veteran Scot shared their stories.

This time however, they were gifted to the Fanconi Anemia Research Fund in honor of Brett & Michael Johnson. These are the sons of Craig Johnson, our Director of Technology here at RSD. Both of these brothers have been diagnosed with the very rare Fanconi Anemia and are in the process of treatment. Brett & Michael were unable to attend our dedication assembly but Mr. Johnson shared with us their journey. 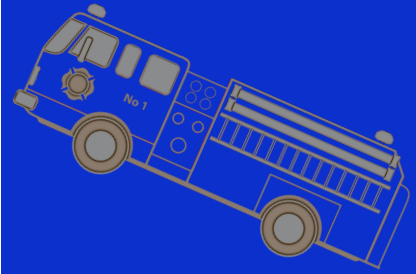
## *Fire Prevention Week*

# Ms. Maddie's Counseling Minutes

Students had a very busy and eventful October in guidance! Elementary classes covered three PBIS focus words (with our Outer Space theme this year, we've been calling them Out of this World Words) that all tied together very nicely. We started with discussing kindness and completing some friendship building activities. Next, we made sure to recognize Bullying Prevention Month by talking about how we can put a stop to bullying and act as upstanders. On October 20th, we also celebrated Unity Day. On this day, staff and students wore orange to show that, as a school community, we are united against bullying and promoting kindness, acceptance, and inclusion. Additionally, K-5 students also created an "Every Step You Take Matters" project, in which they all decorated their own foot outline out of orange paper, with many students writing their ideas down regarding how they are going to put a stop to bullying. This will be displayed in the hallway for the remainder of the school year as a reminder that we should always want our school to be a kind, accepting, and inclusive environment.

We rounded off the month by concentrating on the word diversity. Students did an amazing job explaining the importance of diversity, and agreed that without our differences, the world would be a very boring place! Stay tuned to see what the elementary classes learn about this coming month with the Out of this World Word of giving.

Sixth grade students have been doing a fantastic job working through their Second Step curriculum in their guidance classes! They have finished their Empathy and Communication unit, and are having great conversations while completing their Bullying Prevention lessons. November will bring on some exciting new tasks when being introduced to their career exploration portfolio on the Xello website, as well as the topic of Emotion Management.

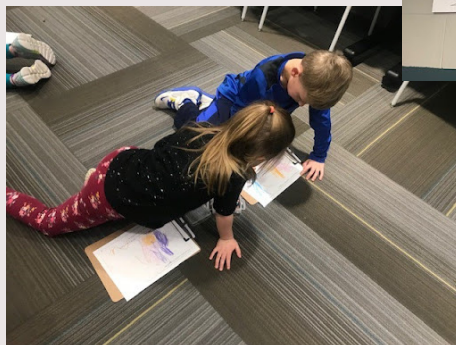
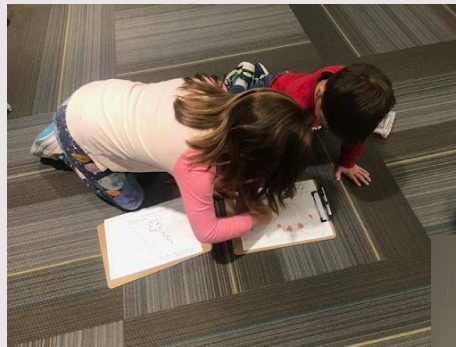
Students in Kindergarten through 5th Grade focused on what it means to be **giving** in the month of November. We discussed how you can give tangible things, like school supplies or clothes and toys you don't use anymore. Additionally, we talked about significant things you can give that can't be held or seen, like friendship, kindness, and love. The kindergarteners are finishing up their friendship books, and covered why giving friendship is important. First graders watched the classic "The Giving Tree" short film narrated by Shel Silverstein, and then created their very own tree that included ideas of what they can give. Second, third, and fourth graders all participated in lessons that revolved around giving empathy. Students thought about how they should try to understand how other people are feeling and then try to help them. The fifth grade classes' work was displayed in the hallway bulletin board this past month, which was a "competition" to see who could brainstorm more ideas of what they can give. They had the topics of talents, thanks, time, talk and treasures.

In December, elementary lessons will center around skills we should work on in order to be **responsible learners**.

Sixth grade students continued to make progress while working through their Second Step Curriculum. Bullying Prevention and Emotional Regulation Units were completed! Students were also introduced to their career exploration website, Xello, and added specific interests, skills, career clusters, and career options to their personal portfolio. December will bring on the topic of problem solving and more directed lessons while considering future options on Xello!

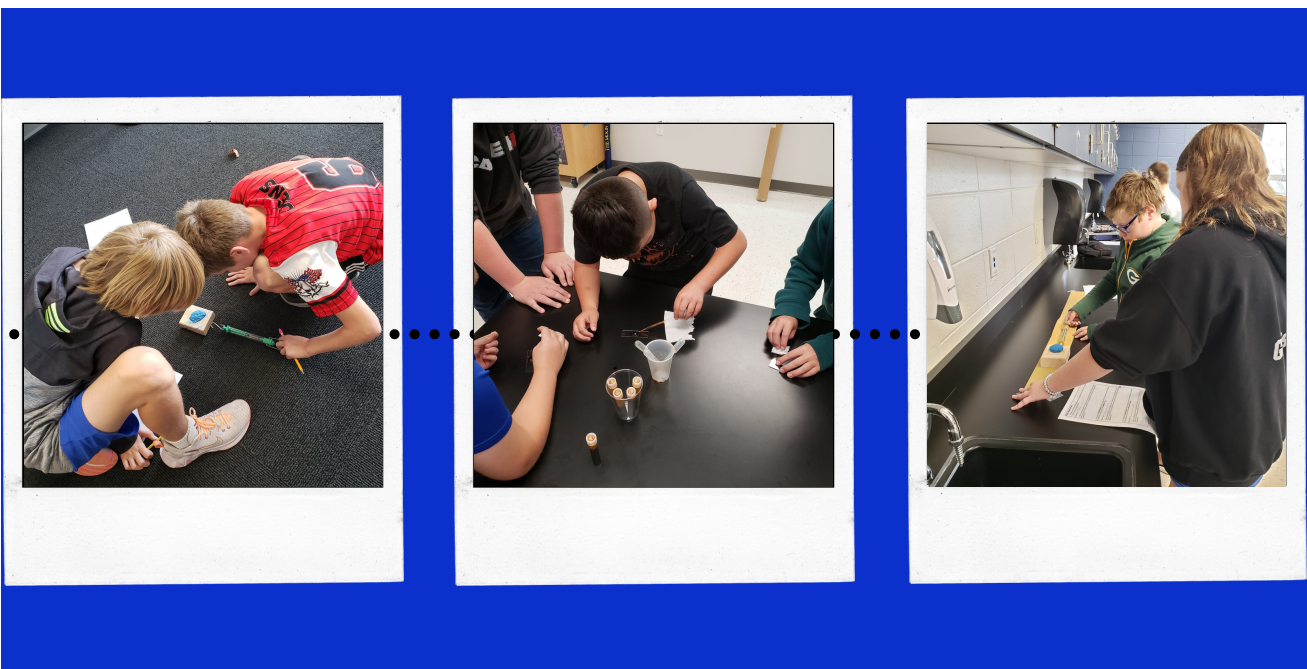

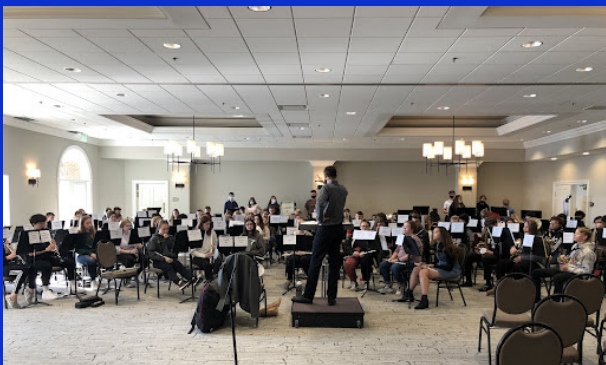

# RANDOLPH SCHOOL DISTRICT



**Friday, February 4, 2022**

The Randolph School District will be conducting a screening for preschool children living in the Randolph School District who will be three or four years old on or before September 1, 2022. The screening will take place at the Randolph Elementary School, located at 110 Meadowood Drive on Friday, February 4, 2022. Please park on the south end of the building, near the basketball courts/baseball diamond and enter through the elementary entrance door #11. A letter will be sent out in January to parents of all four-year-old children with a scheduled screening appointment. Parents of three-year-old children are welcome to schedule an appointment (not required, but encouraged) by contacting the elementary office at (920) 326-2431.

The purpose of the screening is to identify any health-related problems that could interfere with success in school. The screening can also identify developmental delays that could impact adjustment to the school setting. Studies have found that helping children at an early age produces the best outcomes for children and their families versus waiting until the child enters school. Recommendations and referrals will be provided to parents as needed.

Parents, please bring your child's birth certificate (required for identification), address verification (i.e. utility bill, rental agreement, cell phone bill with name & address), baby book, and completed immunization record (or immunization record printed from the Wisconsin Immunization Registry website). Parents should return the Ages & Stages Questionnaire and Child Development Review sheets by Monday, January 24th in the envelope provided. After completion of the screening process, you will receive the results. Should you have a conflict with the schedule or have any questions, please contact the elementary school office at (920) 326-2431. If there is a delayed start or a snow day, the district will contact you to reschedule the screening.

If you are a parent of a child who will be three or four years old on or before September 1, 2022, and have not received information, please contact the Randolph Elementary School office at (920) 326-2431. Nonresident families planning to open enroll their 4-year-old in Randolph Elementary School for the 2022-2023 school year should contact their "resident" district to schedule preschool screening.

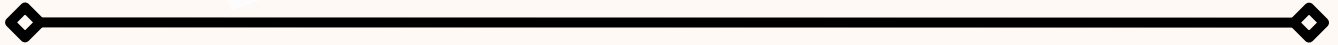
## Randolph Elementary School



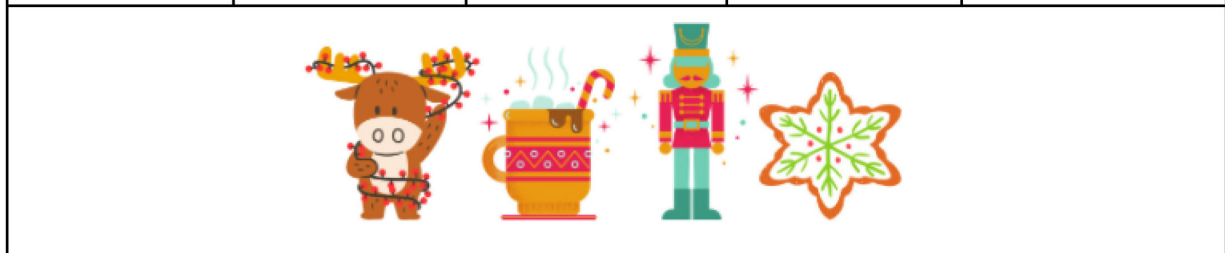
