**Guidelines for the Randolph
ADULT ATHLETIC BOOSTER CLUB SCHOLARSHIP
Two \$250 scholarships**

I. BACKGROUND

This scholarship is awarded by the Randolph Adult Athletic Booster Club. It is established and maintained by the booster club in accordance with the purposes of our organization as defined by our constitution. The Randolph Booster Club is firmly committed to the idea that athletic participation and academic success go hand in hand.

II. GENERAL

- Two scholarships for \$250 each shall be awarded to graduates who have actively participated, shown dedication, and contributed to the athletic programs of Randolph High School. The scholarships are to be used for college or technical school.
- The scholarships shall be administered by the Randolph Booster Club.

III. SELECTION OF THE RECIPIENT

- Application is to be made on forms provided by the Randolph Booster Club. Applications shall be processed by the Randolph Booster Club.
- Applicants must have the recommendations from two instructors who have had the applicant in class, and two recommendations from outside the academic setting.
- The scholarship committee of the Randolph Booster Club shall review and select recipients from the completed applications.

IV. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Must have attended Randolph High School for a minimum of two years.
- Must have earned two varsity letters from Randolph High School by the scholarship deadline.
- Graduate of the current Randolph High School class.
- Recipient should have a 2.0 or higher Grade Point Average
- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in school and community.
- Recipient must include rank in class and grade point average on the application.
A transcript must be included with the application.
- Students must have represented RHS in a positive manner and consistently demonstrated sportsmanship in all athletic events.
- Recipients must not have any Standard of Conduct infractions as outlined by the RSD Co-curricular Code.

V. PAYMENT

The \$250 scholarship will be paid after the completion of the first semester of attendance. Should the recipient of the award choose not to enroll for the first semester of the academic year immediately following graduation, the scholarship shall be forfeited and awarded to an alternate.

Awarding of the \$250 shall be made upon completion of the first semester. Payment shall be made directly to the recipient. No payment shall be made without proof of second semester registration.

*RBC reserves the right to suspend a scholarship for an additional year pending special circumstances.

**Guidelines for the
CAMBRIA AMERICAN LEGION
POST 401 SCHOLARSHIP
Two \$1,000 Scholarships**

I. BACKGROUND

This scholarship is sponsored by the Cambria American Legion Post 401.
Application will be made on forms provided by the American Legion.

II. GENERAL

- This scholarship is open to any student planning on attending a post-secondary school.

III. SELECTION OF THE RECIPIENT

Selection of the recipients shall be made by the Cambria American Legion from all applications.

IV. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school, community and church activities.
- Recipient must be a graduate of the current graduating class of Randolph High School.

V. PAYMENT

Payment of the first half of the scholarship will be made following completion of first semester with a GPA of 2.5 or above and registration for second semester. The second payment will be made following completion of second semester with the same requirements as listed above.

**Guidelines for the Randolph
CHAMBER OF COMMERCE SCHOLARSHIP
One \$500 Scholarship**

I. GENERAL

- One scholarship of \$500.00 shall be awarded to a graduate of the current graduating class of Randolph High School.
- Scholarship money may be used for enrollment at any University, College, Vocational, or Technical School.

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.
- Applicant must have recommendations from two instructors who have had the applicant in class, and two recommendations from outside the academic setting.
- Graduate of the current Randolph High School Class.
- Recipient must be in the upper 50% of the class.
- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.
- Applicant should be entering the **field of business**. Primary consideration will be given to an applicant who is working for or is a **child of a Chamber Member**. Should no one meet these criteria, will be **awarded to the most deserving applicant**.
- Recipient should include grade point average and rank in class on the application and attach a transcript showing the courses taken in High School. This information should be provided by the High School Office.
- The recipient should also include any information pertaining to financial needs, physical needs and any special circumstances that may apply.

III. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of the High School comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor, and five staff members, shall review the completed applications and recommend three recipients. The Randolph Chamber of Commerce will make the final selection after reviewing the recommendations and all of the applications.

IV. PAYMENT

Scholarship is to be paid following the completion of the first semester and the confirmation of registration for the second semester. Evidence of registration must be mailed or delivered to Betty Eisenga of the Randolph Chamber of Commerce. Should the recipient of the scholarship choose not to enroll for the first semester immediately following graduation, the scholarship will be awarded to the alternate.

**Guidelines for the
CLASS OF 1952
One \$1,000 Scholarship**

I. GENERAL

- **The Class of 1952 Scholarship is a fund that was established to honor the class. The classmates donate money to award a \$1,000 scholarship annually.**

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- **Applications are to be made on forms provided by the Randolph High School. Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.**
- **Applicant must have recommendations from two instructors who have had the applicant in class, and two recommendations from outside the academic setting.**
- **Graduate of the current Randolph High School graduating class that is planning on a career in education. If there is no applicant in the field of education, the Committee will choose a worthy recipient**

III. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

- **The scholarship committee of the Randolph High School comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor, and five staff members, shall make the final selection based on the criteria listed above.**

IV. PAYMENT

- **Scholarship will be paid following the completion of the first semester and the confirmation of registration for the second semester. Should the recipient not attend school for the first semester of the academic year following high school graduation, the scholarship shall be forfeited and the money added to the endowment. Grades and proof of registration for second semester should be brought to the Randolph High School Office.**

**Guidelines for the
DAVID M. NIEMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
One \$500 Scholarship**

This scholarship is awarded in memory of David M. Nieman. David was a graduate of Randolph High School where he was active in football, basketball, baseball, FFA, Letter Club and a member of the Yearbook staff. After graduation, David was a member of the Randolph Booster Club and the FFA Alumni, helping to support high school students.

It is a fitting tribute to David that this scholarship in his name will benefit a student furthering his/her education.

I. GENERAL

One scholarship in the amount of \$400 shall be awarded to a graduate of the current graduating class of Randolph High School. The scholarship shall be **open to any major** in an accredited vocational school or four year college.

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Applications are to be on forms provided by the Randolph High School. Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.
- Applicant must be a graduating member of current senior class of Randolph High School.
- Applications must have the recommendation of two people outside of the school system and two teachers.
- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.
- Recipient must include rank in class and GPA on the application and attach a transcript showing the courses taken in high school. This information will be provided by the high school office.
- Academics are not the determining factor. Selection is mainly based on the desire and ability to go on to post secondary school.
- **A handwritten essay on the following questions must be attached to the application.**
What are your major accomplishments and how have they given you satisfaction as a person?

III. SELECTION OF THE RECIPIENT

The Nieman family will make the final selection of the recipient after reviewing all of the applications.

IV. PAYMENT

The scholarship will be paid on the basis of \$150 following completion of first semester and \$150 paid at the end of March. Should the recipient of the scholarship choose not to enroll for the first semester immediately following graduation, the scholarship will be forfeited. Also, no payment shall be made if the recipient has not registered for second semester. To receive the first payment, recipient needs to contact Karen Nieman after completion of each semester with grades and proof of registration for the following semester.

**DOUGLAS M. KOHLBECK LETTER CLUB
LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP
Amount/s not clarified**

I. BACKGROUND

This scholarship is supported by funds provided for by the Randolph Letter Club.

II. GENERAL

- The scholarship is intended for a student attending a two or four year college.
- The dollar amount and the number of scholarships will depend upon the financial condition of the Letter Club.
- The scholarship shall be administered by the Randolph High School Letter Club.

III. SELECTION OF THE RECIPIENT

- Selection of the recipient(s) shall be made by the Letter Club advisor with the determination of the recipient(s) to be made by the points accumulated in the Letter Club Program of Activities.
- The recipient should be in good academic standing.

IV. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- The recipient must have attended Randolph High School for a least three years (exceptions will be at the discretion of the Letter Club advisor).
- The student must have declared a major at a two or four year college.
- The recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship, high moral standards, and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.

V. PAYMENT

The scholarship(s) will be paid upon proof of registration for the second semester and grades for first semester. Should the recipient of the scholarship choose not to enroll in the fall semester of the academic year immediately following graduation, the scholarship will be forfeited.

**Guidelines for the Randolph
EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP
One \$500 Scholarship**

I. GENERAL

- One scholarship of \$200.00 shall be awarded to a graduate of the current Randolph High School graduating class.
- Scholarship money may be used for enrollment at any University, College, Vocational, Technical or Nursing School

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.
- Applicant must have recommendations from two instructors who have had the applicant in class, and two recommendations from outside the academics setting.
- Graduate of the current Randolph High School Class.
- Applicant should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.
- Applicant should be going into a career in the medical field with **primary consideration given to those studying to be doctors or nurses and then to all other medical fields.**
- Applicant should include grade point average and rank in class on the application and attach a transcript showing the courses taken in High School. This information should be provided by the High School Office.
- The applicant should also include any information pertaining to financial needs, physical needs and any special circumstances that may apply.

III. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of the High School, comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor and five staff members, shall review the completed applications and recommend three recipients. The Randolph E.M.S. will make the final selection after reviewing the recommendations and all the applications.

IV. PAYMENT

Scholarship money to be paid to the recipient following the completion of the first semester and the confirmation of registration for the second semester. Evidence of registration must be mailed or delivered to the Randolph E.M.S. at the Randolph Village Hall. Should the recipient of the award choose to not enroll the first semester of the academic year immediately following High School graduation, the scholarship will be forfeited and awarded to the alternate. The scholarship would also be forfeited if the recipient does not continue in the medical field.

SCHOLARSHIP CHECK WILL BE VOIDED IF NOT PICKED UP IN JANUARY OF THE YEAR FOLLOWING HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION.

**Guideline for the
EVANS EDGEWOOD SCHOLARSHIP
One Scholarship-Amount is as interest allows**

I. BACKGROUND

The Edgewood College Scholarship is sponsored by Mary Evans and is intended to assist a student who wishes to attend Edgewood College. Mary Evans was a graduate of Edgewood and wishes to help a student who attends Edgewood with their college expenses. The recipient is chosen from applicants who are accepted at Edgewood College.

II. GENERAL

One scholarship in the amount of \$100 shall be awarded to a graduate of the current graduating class of the Randolph High School. The scholarship shall be open to any student attending Edgewood College. Amount calculated for payout is based on interest money earned and may be more or less than the amount stated depending on interest rates.

III. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of the Randolph High School, comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor and five staff members, shall review the completed applications for this scholarship and select the recipient.

IV. PAYMENT

The scholarship will be paid following completion of first semester and registration for second semester. Should the recipient of the scholarship choose not to enroll for the first semester immediately following graduation, the scholarship will be forfeited. The scholarship shall be administered by Randolph High School who shall supply and collect the scholarship applications. First semester grades and proof of registration for second semester should be brought to the Randolph High School Office.

**Guidelines for the Randolph
FIRE DEPARTMENT SCHOLARSHIP
One \$400 Scholarship**

I. GENERAL

- One scholarship of \$400.00 shall be awarded to a graduate of the current graduating class of Randolph High School.
- Scholarship money may be used for enrollment at any University, College, Vocational, Technical or Nursing School.

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.
- Applicant must have recommendations from two instructors who have had the applicant in class, and two recommendations from outside the academic setting.
- Graduate of the current Randolph High School Class.
- Recipient must have a GPA of “C” or better.
- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.
- Recipient should be going into a career of **Fire Fighting** or **Medical Profession**.
- Recipient should include grade point average and rank in class on the application and attach a transcript showing the courses taken in High School. This information should be provided by the High School Office.
- The recipient should also include any information pertaining to financial needs, physical needs and any special circumstances that may apply.

III. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of the High School, comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor, and five staff members, shall review the completed applications and recommend three recipients. The Randolph Fire Department will make the final selection after reviewing the recommendations and all of the applications.

IV. PAYMENT

Scholarship is paid on the basis of \$400.00 following the completion of the first semester and the confirmation of registration for the second semester. Evidence of registration must be mailed or delivered to the Randolph Fire Department. Should the recipient of the scholarship choose not to enroll for the first semester immediately following graduation, the scholarship will be forfeited.

**Guidelines for the
FLOYD L. & VIOLA A. McMORRAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN FOUNDATION
Amount varies each year**

I. GENERAL

- This scholarship is made possible by the University of Wisconsin Foundation by the bequest of Floyd and Viola McMorran, former students of Randolph High School and residents of Randolph.
- Three scholarships of approx. \$500.00* shall be awarded to a graduate of the current graduating class of Randolph High School planning to attend any University of Wisconsin two year or four year campus pursuing a 2 or 4 year degree.

**Amounts calculated for payout are based on interest money earned on the McMorran Trust Account and may be less than amounts stated should interest rates decline.*

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Applications are to be made on forms provided by Randolph High School. Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.
- Applicant must have recommendations from 2 instructors who have had the applicant in class, and 2 recommendations from outside the academic setting.
- Graduate of the current Randolph High School class.
- Recipient should be in the upper 50% of the class.
- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school, community and church activities.
- Recipient should include grade point average and rank in class on the application and attach a transcript showing the courses taken in high school. This information will be provided by the High School office.
- The recipient should also include any information pertaining to financial needs, physical needs and any special circumstances that may apply.

III. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of the High School comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor, and five staff members, shall review the completed applications for each scholarship and select one recipient and an alternate for each.

IV. PAYMENT

Scholarships will be paid on the basis of \$250.00* per semester for the first two semesters of attendance. Should the recipient of the award choose not to enroll the first semester of the academic year immediately following High School graduation, the scholarship shall be forfeited and awarded to the alternate.

Awarding of the first payment shall follow confirmation of registration for the first semester. Payment shall be made directly to the school by the UW-Foundation, specific directions will be provided to the recipients regarding this process.

The Iral and Barbara Schreiber Memorial Scholarship
One \$1,000 Scholarship**

I. GENERAL

This scholarship is awarded in the name of Iral “Ike” Schreiber and his wife, Barbara Schreiber. Ike, a resident of Randolph for more than ninety years, loved his community and this school. This was where he participated in basketball and baseball and became the salutatorian of his class. His wife Barb was a teacher at RHS for 34 years. She had a deep, abiding passion for her profession and for her students.

In their names, this scholarship will be awarded to a student of the current graduation class of RHS who is planning to attend a 4-year college pursuing a degree in either engineering or education.

I. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.

Applicants must have recommendations from two instructors who have had the applicant in class and two recommendations from outside of the academic setting.

Applicants must be a graduate of the current Randolph High School class.

Applicants should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.

Applicants must be going into a career in the field of engineering or education.

Applicants should include GPA and rank in class on the application and attach a transcript showing the courses taken at Randolph High School. This information should be provided by the High School Office.

The Applicant should also include information pertaining to financial needs, physical needs, and any special circumstances that may apply.

II. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of Randolph High School, comprised of the Principal, guidance counselor, and five staff members shall review the completed application and recommend a finalist and an alternate, who will receive the scholarship if the finalist forfeits the award.

III. PAYMENT

Scholarship money will be paid to the recipient following the completion of the first semester and the confirmation of registration for the second semester. Evidence of registration must be mailed or delivered to the Randolph High School Guidance Department. Should the recipient of the award choose not to enroll the first semester of the academic year immediately following high school graduation, the scholarship will be forfeited and awarded to the alternate. The scholarship would also be forfeited if the recipient does not continue in the field of engineering or education.

**Guidelines for the Randolph
JAMES EVANS SCHOLARSHIP
One \$100 Scholarship**

This scholarship is awarded in memory of James Evans. James was a graduate of Randolph High School where he became interested in the field of medicine. James was pursuing a degree in the medical field when he passed away. It is a fitting tribute to James that this scholarship in his name will benefit a student furthering his/her education in the field of medicine.

I. GENERAL

One scholarship in the amount of \$100 shall be awarded to a graduate of the current graduating class of Randolph High School. The scholarship shall be open to any student **majoring in a medical field** in an accredited vocational school or four year college. Amount calculated for payout is based on interest money earned and may be more than the amount stated depending on interest rates.

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Application shall be made on forms provided by Randolph High School. Applications shall be processed by RHS and forwarded to the Evans family for consideration.
- Applicants must be a graduating member of current senior class of Randolph High School.
- Applications must have the recommendation of two people outside of the school system and two teachers.
- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.
- Recipient must include rank in class and GPA on the application and attach a transcript showing the courses taken in high school. This information should be provided by the high school office.
- Academics are not the determining factor. Selection is mainly based on the **DESIRE AND ABILITY** to go on to post-secondary school.

III. SELECTION OF THE RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of the High School comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor, and five staff members, shall review the completed applications for this scholarship and select the recipient

IV. PAYMENT

The scholarship will be paid following completion of first semester and registration for second semester. Should the recipient of the scholarship choose not to enroll for the first semester immediately following graduation, the scholarship will be forfeited. The scholarship shall be administered by Randolph High School who shall supply and collect the scholarship applications. First semester grades and proof of registration for second semester should be brought to the Randolph High School Office.

JOHN SHESKEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
One \$1,000 Scholarship**

John Sheskey was a former student of Randolph High School. Mr. Sheskey placed a high value on education. Though Mr. Sheskey passed away in January, 2015, his family is continuing this scholarship to help a deserving student further his or her education.

I. GENERAL

- Scholarships shall be for \$1,000.00 each, awarded to a graduate of the current graduating class of Randolph High School.
- Scholarship may be used for enrollment at any University, College, Business College, or Vocational School.

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Applications are to be made on forms provided by Randolph High School. Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.
- Application must have recommendations from 2 instructors who have had the applicant in class, and 2 recommendations from outside the academic setting.
 - Graduate of the current Randolph High School graduating class.
 - Recipient should be in the top 50% of the class.
 - Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.
 - Recipient should be someone who will benefit from the education. Rank in class and G.P.A will not always be the major factor.

III. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of the High School, comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor, and five staff members, shall review the completed applications and select a recipient and an alternate.

IV. PAYMENT

The scholarship will be paid following completion of first semester and registration for second semester. Should the recipient of the scholarship choose not to enroll for the first semester immediately following graduation, the scholarship will be forfeited. The scholarship shall be administered by Randolph High School who shall supply and collect the scholarship applications. First semester grades and proof of registration for second semester should be brought to the Randolph High School Office.

LISA KAUL MEMORIAL PTO SCHOLARSHIP
Two \$250 or One \$500 Scholarship**

I. GENERAL

- One scholarship in the amount of \$250 shall be awarded to a graduate of the current graduating class of Randolph High School.
- Scholarship money may be used for enrollment at any University, College, Vocational or Technical School.

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Application shall be made on forms provided by Randolph High School. Applications shall be processed by RHS and forwarded to the PTO for consideration.
- Applicants must be a graduating member of current senior class of Randolph High School.
- Applicant must have recommendations from two instructors who have had the applicant in class, and two recommendations from outside the academic setting.
- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.
- Recipient must include rank in class and GPA on the application and attach a transcript showing the courses taken in high school. This information should be provided by the high school office.
- Academics are not the determining factor. **Selection is mainly based on the student showing exemplary community service and volunteerism.**

III. SELECTION OF THE RECIPIENT

The PTO will make the final selection of the recipient after reviewing all of the applications.

IV. PAYMENT

The scholarship will be paid following completion of first semester and registration for second semester. First semester grades and proof of registration for second semester should be brought to Julie Bahr of the Randolph PTO. Should the recipient of the scholarship choose not to enroll for the first semester immediately following graduation, the scholarship will be forfeited.

LORI ANNE FEIL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
One \$500 Scholarship**

I. GENERAL

One scholarship in the amount of \$500 shall be awarded to a graduate of the current graduating class of Randolph High School. The scholarship shall be **open to any major** in an accredited vocational school or four year college.

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Applications are to be on forms provided by the Randolph High School. Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.
- Applicants must be a graduating member of the current senior class of Randolph High School.
- Recipient should have a GPA of 3.00 or higher.
- Applicant must have recommendations from two instructors who have had applicant in class and two recommendations from outside the academic setting.
- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been an active participant in home, school and community activities.

III. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of the High School, comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor, and five staff members, shall review the completed applications and select a recipient and an alternate.

IV. PAYMENT

Payment shall be made following proof of completion of first semester and registration for second semester. Evidence of registration and enrollment must be made to the Randolph High School Office. Should the recipient of the award choose not to enroll the first semester of the academic year immediately following High School graduation, the scholarship shall be forfeited and awarded to the alternate.

MARY ELLEN LLOYD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
One \$100 Scholarship**

The Mary Ellen Lloyd Scholarship is made possible by the bequest of her son, Harrison H. Lloyd. Mrs. Lloyd was an avid supporter of many Randolph student endeavors.

I. GENERAL

- At the discretion of the Randolph High School Scholarship Committee, one scholarship of approximately \$100.00* will be awarded to a deserving senior.
- Scholarship shall be for approximately \$100 awarded to graduate of the current Randolph High School graduating class. *Amounts calculated for payout are based on interest money earned on the Lloyd Account and may be less than amount stated depending on interest rates.
- Scholarships shall be used for attendance at a **four year college or university**.

II. CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

- Graduate of the current Randolph High School class
- Recipient should have a GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- Applications are to be made on forms provided by Randolph High School. Applications will be available from and processed at the Randolph High School.
- Applicant must include two recommendations from the academic setting and two from outside.
- Recipient should exemplify qualities of good citizenship and have been active in home, school, and community activities.
- The recipient should also include any information pertaining to financial needs, physical needs and any special circumstances that may apply.

III. SELECTION OF RECIPIENT

The scholarship committee of the Randolph High School, comprised of the Principal, Guidance Counselor and five staff members, shall review the completed applications for this scholarship and select the recipients and alternates.

IV. PAYMENT

The scholarships shall be paid after completion of first semester and registration for second semester. Recipients should contact the Randolph High School for payment.
